Section 661: NEWBORN AND INFANT SCREENING AND TREATMENT CODE

Section 661.610 Responsibilities of Medical Care Facilities Excerpts

Newborn hearing screening shall be performed by an individual who is supervised by a licensed healthcare professional (recommended to be a licensed audiologist per 2019 Joint Committee on Infant Hearing Statement). The supervising healthcare professional and screener shall be trained in the following areas:

- Anatomy and physiology of the ear;
- Nature of responses being measured;
- Patient and non-patient factors that influence responses;
- Hearing screening procedures;
- Documentation of results;
- Type of screening equipment to be used;
- Operation of the screening equipment;
- Time frames for screening;
- Provision of results to the parents, legal guardian or caregiver, the primary medical care provider, and the Department;
- Confidentiality requirements;
- Communication of accurate and appropriate information;
- The plan of care if the newborn or infant passed the hearing screening; and
- The plan of care if the newborn or infant did not pass the hearing screening.

This competency-based course is designed to provide the learner with a thorough understanding of the components necessary for conducting quality newborn hearing screening while meeting the training requirements.
