BIRTHING FACILITY-REQUIRED INFORMATION FOR PARENT DISSEMINATION

Section 661.610:
Responsibilities of Medical Care Facilities Excerpts

- All medical care facilities shall provide written information to all parents, legal guardians or caregivers before the newborn hearing screening is administered. The written information shall include:
 - Purpose and benefits of the hearing screening;
 - Description of typical auditory development;
 - Description of the procedures used for hearing screening;
 - Risk factors for hearing loss;
 - Factors that could result in a referral for further hearing screening; and;
 - Importance of timely follow-up for hearing testing and intervention.
- After completion of the newborn hearing screening, medical care facilities shall provide to parents, legal guardians, or caregivers, orally and in writing, the following information:
 - Time, date, screening technology and individual-ear screening results for the final screening session prior to discharge; and
 - Follow-up plan of care, including the coordination of followup screening or diagnostic appointments and service locations.

IDPH provides informational brochures on newborn hearing screening and appropriate follow-up that meet these requirements. These brochures are free of charge in English/Spanish and may be printed on-demand in other languages.
